

So that you feel clear about the teaching and learning intentions for the Summer Term 2024, I hope you enjoy reading this overview, as we hope that you find it helpful...

The focus will be a Geography knowledge-based project based on Transport and Travel (Transport / Journey Through Europe).

The children will know and understand key information about the countries that form Europe - flags, capital cities, landmarks etc. They will learn what the Euro is, the wide variety of languages spoken in Europe and

In the course of this learning, the children will use a range of geographical and research skills to help them investigate Europe and demonstrate that they are able to explain about the climate and landscape, including mountain ranges and rivers of different European countries and the famous art and architecture that can be found in Europe. They will select and use appropriate skills and ways of presenting information to help them investigate the different modes of transport for travelling around Europe, including the physical and human features of different locations for airport travel.-This will provide the children with high quality material for developing skills in English and Mathematics, Artistic skills, Personal and Social Education and will link strongly with other subjects across the curriculum to create an overarching 'project' theme.

English work will include writing to entertain (narrative and poetry) and to inform (Non-Chronological Reports/Diaries/Instructions). All the texts we share will support the learning of subject vocabulary and help put the children 'in the context' of our class project. We will read a story text together which will connect with the project and support vocabulary and understanding and reading for pleasure.

Mathematics work will involve number including fractions, simple decimals and measures of mass and capacity. They will develop knowledge and understanding 2D and 3D shapes and their properties. There will be a continued focus on learning multiplication tables, especially for the Year 4 children, as the MTC (Multiplication Tables Check) takes place in May. I hope that you will continue to use TTRockstars and Prodigy, which will be tailored to back up what is happening in class – so far there has been a lot of progress – but still a long way to go!

Other curriculum areas:

- Science knowledge will focus on the strands related to Forces & Magnets and completing the unit of learning on Light.
- In Art, the children will knowledge through the study of architecture and Giacoma Balla.
- RE knowledge will learning about the importance of Pilgrimages and Special Journeys.
- PHSE/RSE will follow the Jigsaw program Relationships and Changing Me.
- Music learning will involve Musical Processes and Textures in music.
- French vocabulary knowledge will be developed through School, Seasons and Weather.
- Computing knowledge will relate to an understanding Animation and Presentation of work.
- In PE, the children will be undertaking activities with our sports provider Premier Education. The children will be developing skills, control, coordination and teamwork through Multi Skills Sessions. They will also be working on development of athletics skills, physical movement, and special awareness in Striking and Fielding Games.


