Hello again ...

This term we will be learning all about 'Toys! Toys! Toys!' We will have had a lovely Christmas break and will be all excited to talk about our toys, so we thought that this would make for an engaging basis for a project.

We will begin by looking at the toys we just received for Christmas. Describing these toys will help us to understand that we all have different preferences and that we can share and play together. We will then move on to looking at toys that we had as a baby, but perhaps don't play with now, and why. We will also be looking at toys that people used to play with in times gone by, and in particular, how the good old teddy bear has changed over time. We will look at some of the toys that children might play with in different parts of the world, especially puppets. We will be doing lots of making and imagining with boxes. We ask you if ever have anything delivered in a **massive** box, please do not throw it away. These **huge** boxes are great to use in school, to be anything from a boat to a bus.

We keep going with our reading and writing by remembering those letter sounds and words to help us to read and write a sentence and finding out about what we need to write a good sentence; like capital letters, full stops and spaces, as well the terms 'noun' 'verb' and 'adjective'. We need to remember what all the numbers look like because this term we are going up to twenty and beyond. We will be using what we know about numbers to help us to solve measuring problems and to use the correct words for positions.

We would like to share what we are learning about towards the end of term on Tuesday 2nd April from 2:30 onwards. This will be a time for us to show what we have been learning about. Details on Dojo, nearer the time.

Before we know it, it will be half term again, so keep on with those letters, reading and numbers... you are doing a fantastic job in helping your child have those precious skills at their fingertips. See you soon.

Homework Update:

For homework your child will have a:

- 📖 Reading Book which they have chosen. It is lovely to hear about other books they read or listen to as well
- 📖 Little Pink Sounds book where we will add new sounds. We have done all the single sounds and will now be looking at two or 3 sounds that we put together to make another sound. These are called digraphs and trigraphs.
- 📖 Word Bag filled with high frequency words which we check on a Friday and give out more of the top 100 useful words

Remember to carry on looking at and talking about **numbers** and **letters** as you're out and about, they need to be as familiar as cats and dogs.
