Bikeability


We try to include Bikeability into our Year 5 & 6 curriculum timetable every year as we believe it is important to help teach the skills needed to be safe on the road as our children get older and gradually want to develop more independence. Their course gives children the confidence to use their cycles on residential roads by developing cycling skills, creating positive attitudes towards road users and increasing knowledge and understanding of the rules of the road.
